

Board Elections - 2023

The week of January 2nd the CIAB will begin board elections for the seats highlighted in gray below that expire on June 30, 2023. Board election materials will be emailed to growers and handlers. If your email is not on file with the CIAB, materials will be sent to you via regular mail. You are welcome to return your nomination and/or ballot via email to info@cherryboard.org.

In crop year 2022 Wisconsin's three-year average production is greater than 10 million pounds. Therefore, per the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) §930.20 board membership, Wisconsin will increase by one seat. This will change Wisconsin from one at-large seat to one grower and one handler seat.

The board election for the grower member seat in Utah and Wisconsin was conducted in November. Both a grower and handler seat are up for election this cycle in Utah and Wisconsin. Per the CIAB voting procedures the grower member, handler member, grower alternate, and handler alternate nomination and ballot processes are completed in this sequence to avoid a sales constituency conflict when both a grower and handler seat are up for election in the same cycle. The elected nominees are highlighted below in green. Please note nominees are not officially seated on the board until the CIAB receives a signed selection order from the Secretary of Agriculture.

The current Utah grower alternate Tami Balzly is term limited as she has severed two consecutive 3-year terms on the board as an alternate.

We look forward to your participation in the election process of CIAB representatives.
